Catholic Schools Open Week (CSOW) Term 3, Week 4 – Monday August 9 to Sunday August 15 2021

Schools are encouraged to hold events such as Principal's Tours and Open Days to coincide with these weeks.

Through the focus of Raising our Hearts and Minds to God we will follow a three-year cycle of themes to reflect on and provide opportunities that deepen students experiences and understanding.

Each year we will add to this collection of resources that will unpack the theme for that year.

The three-year focus cycle of themes are:

2021 - Raising Hearts and Minds to the wonder and awe of God's creation

Activity 2 - School students invited to share Grace

Below are two compositions of grace that you might like to use to demonstrate our shared commitment to ecological conversion and action.

You might also like to encourage students to embrace the practice of saying grace in their homes with their families.



Grace #1

Loving God, We ask you to bless this food which comes to us through the work of many people, from the sowing of seeds in the earth to our table here today. We pray for those in our world who do not have enough food. Help us to always care for people and your beautiful creation.

Amen.

Grace #2

Loving God, Thank you for the food we are about to eat. Thank you for the people who made it. We pray for all those who do not have enough to eat. Help us to care for all creation.

Amen.



Other Ideas

Prayer Garden

Explore opportunities for establishing a prayer garden. Do you have a garden space at school that could be developed? Students can design a prayer garden and contribute ideas for planning and establishing.

Creation Walk

Be present, capture details or beauty in God's world. Use a microscopic lens on your device to capture this.

Journal

What in creation speaks to your heart? What message does scripture give you about our precious world and environment? What message of action does this scripture call you to do?

Pop-up Prayer Space

Provide a pop-up prayer space outside for students to write prayers of praise or gratitude for God's creation.

Sacred Space

Invite staff and/or community members to share a sacred experience of creation, where they have experienced God's presence and love.

Meditation

Students write a Christian meditation and conduct this prayer outside. Share this experience with another class.

Community Prayer / Liturgy

Plan an outdoor community prayer/liturgy with a focus on ecology.

Poster

Capture your favourite quote from Laudato si' and present your poster at an assembly. Publish these posters in your school newsletter.

Opening Prayer

We gather intentionally to quell the noise of distraction

We humbly invite the loving presence of God amongst us

We acknowledge the presence of Jesus when two or more gather in his name.

God of hope,

Open our hands to do Your work.

Maranatha... Come Lord Jesus

Practice

- Use the sacred word Maranatha as the symbol of your intent to open yourself to God's presence and action within
- Maranatha is from the Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke, meaning 'Come Lord Jesus'
- Sit comfortably, close your eyes and interiorly repeat the sacred word slowly and silently as four syllables MA RA NA THA
- When you become aware of thoughts, emotions and physical sensations, return ever so gently to the sacred word
- At the end of the Christian meditation session, remain in silence for a minute or two before you resume your meeting.

Closing Prayer

Compassionate God, we thank you for the many blessings in our lives. We ask for wisdom, compassion, justice and love to join us as we meet - to inspire and support us.

We ask this in Jesus name

Awake, Aware and Alert: Prayerful Gratitude

Practicing Gratitude

An act of gratitude is a living whole.

To be awake, aware, and alert are the beginning, middle, and end of gratitude. This gives us the clue to what the three basic steps of practicing gratitude must be.

Opening Prayer

Dear Lord, help me to be open to you now, and all this day. Believing that you are everywhere, may I sense your presence with me now. May I learn anew that you love to be with me. Amen.

The Practice

Step One: Wake Up -

We need to practice waking up to surprise. Ask yourself, where have I been surprised by God's presence? How might I be more attentive to the presence of God in my work, in my conversations and in my interactions? How might being open to the surprise of God's presence change or challenge how I live this day.

Step Two: Be Aware of Opportunities -

"What's my opportunity here?" You will find that most of the time, the opportunity that a given moment offers you is an opportunity to enjoy—to enjoy sounds, smells, tastes, texture, colours, and, with still deeper joy, friendliness, kindness, patience, faithfulness, honesty, and all those gifts that soften the soil of our heart like warm spring rain. How might these opportunities develop our relationship with God and sow the seeds of gratitude for my colleagues and my work.

Step Three: Respond Alertly -

Once we are in practice for being awake to surprise and being aware of the opportunity at hand, we will spontaneously be alert in our response, especially when we are offered an opportunity to enjoy something. How might an alert and attentive response draw me closer to God.

Closing Prayer

Loving God

I pray for the wisdom to be open to surprise for the clarity of seeing the opportunity in that moment For the wisdom to see the gift within the gift For the alertness to avail myself fully of the opportunity offered to me today For the gift of this life We make this prayer in Jesus' name

An Examen

Rummaging for God: Praying Backwards through Your Day By Dennis Hamm, SJ

Fr. Dennis Hamm, SJ, a scripture professor at Creighton University, calls the Daily Examen "rummaging for God." He likens it to "going through a drawer full of stuff, feeling around, looking for something that you are sure must be there." That's an accurate description of what it's like to pray the Daily Examen. We look back on the previous day, rummaging through the "stuff," and finding God in it. We know God is there.

A Prayer to God

God, thank you.

I thank you, God, for always being with me, but especially I am grateful that you are with me right now.

God, send your Holy Spirit upon me.

God, let the Holy Spirit enlighten my mind and warm my heart that I may know where and how we have been together this day.

God, let me look at my day.

God, where have I felt your presence, seen your face, heard your word this day? God, where have I ignored you, run from you, perhaps even rejected you this day?

God, let me be grateful and ask forgiveness.

God, I thank you for the times this day we have been together and worked together. God, I am sorry for the ways that I have offended you by what I have done or what I did not do.

God, stay close.

God, I ask that you draw me ever closer to you this day and tomorrow. God, you are the God of my life—thank you.
